We have grown!

In 11 years Bevan Community School has grown from a one room nursery class to a full primary school with 10 year groups. From giving food and an education to one class of children we now educate and feed 300! And that's not all, last year our first Primary 7 class graduated and some of the children progressed to secondary school or vocational college. The charity is determined to support children, where we can, to progress and ultimately be able to support their future families. Our fundraising this year is focussed



on raising money to enable this to happen.

We are therefore thrilled to welcome three new trustees!
Neil, Alison and Keith visited and volunteered in the village last year. They bring a wealth of skills and knowledge of working in sub

Saharan Africa to our charity. Alison is a trained occupational therapist and is supporting nurses Brenda and Desire with the special needs group. Neil and Keith have supported by producing disability aids and building a school playground. They are also spreading our charity news and fundraising for our work in their local area in North Wales.

Feeding the children!

Do you know?

We have 57 sponsored children attending Bevan school whose sponsorship pays for their school food and education. Some children's parents contribute what they can to their costs. We also have 62 'needy' children attending school whose family cannot contribute but they haven't yet got a sponsor. We are passionate about these children receiving an education so currently fund these children by our fundraising.



300 breakfasts!


The children drink a thin porridge made of maize meal, sugar and water.

300 lunches!

The children eat posho - a maize meal paste with a bean stew and sometimes cabbage

It costs approximately £90 per day to feed these 300 children.





Like everywhere in the world food prices in Uganda have greatly increased. We spend a large percentage of our budget on feeding the children. We think that this is money well spent because it could be the only food the children get that day and a happy, healthy child will learn well.

Other news



Work has started on a dedicated building for Daniel's Clinic. This will provide much needed extra space for the clinic services including our Special Needs initiative.



Whilst Bevan Community School is a good school compared to other Ugandan Schools it is still poorly resourced. One of our aims is to address this so were thrilled to be able to buy text books for the P7 class. £230 bought 41 books which will enable the students to study more independently towards their Primary Leaving Exam. Our aim is to supply the other classes with books. We even aspire to providing some IT resources!

What can you do?

Sponsor a child

£25 a month will provide schooling, uniform and food for a child in desperate need.

Sponsor school needs

Any regular contribution to the school will enable us to provide education for needy children who haven't got a sponsor

£20 per month will provide food at school for 3 children

£10 per month will provide 30 children with school stationery

Eg. £6 will provide a school text book, £10 will provide uniform for one child
